

Daily Reported New Positive COVID-19 Tests vs. Daily Reported Deaths with COVID-19 in the U.S.



Current COVID-19 U.S. Patients Hospitalized and in the ICU





According to Burbio, as of February 14, 2021, the percent of U.S. K-12 students attending "virtual-only" schools has declined to 33.6%, the lowest point since Burbio began tracking in August 2020. This measure peaked at 62% over Labor Day. Currently 40.8% of K-12 students are attending "in-person/every day" schools while 25.6% are attending "hybrid" schools.

Daily COVID-19 Vaccine Doses Administered in the U.S.


December 21, 2020 - February 17, 2021, 7-Day Moving Average

COVID-19 Deaths per Million People in Areas with Very Different Lockdown Policies


